ASPEN TRIP REPORT

Our final ski trip of the year was to fabled Aspen. An early start with a bus pick up in De Pere at 4:30 am, a stop in Appleton, then on to Chicago for our nonstop flight to Denver. We got there with all our luggage and met up with our out-a-town friends from Tucson, Phoenix, and Green Bay and then our 5 - hour bus ride to Aspen (with an obligatory stop at Applejacks). We checked in the fabulous Gant condo complex and waited for our late arriving friends who took their own flights into Aspen airport.

First day in Aspen was a bit windy, several lifts were closed at each of the 4 mountains at Aspen. We started at Buttermilk, and when we skied out that hill by lunch, we took the bus over to the main Aspen Mountain to finish the afternoon skiing with the big boys (and girls). That evening, we were at a reception hosted by The Gant, at Ryno's Pub in downtown Aspen. The Gant had 4 ski clubs staying there that week, Sanctuary from Chicago, Thunderbirds from Detroit, the Columbus (Ohio) Ski Club, and us. Ryno's put out pizzas, wings, nachos, and more for the hundred and fifty or so skiers. We actually picked up skiers from each group when some late cancellations opened extra spots in our roster. Our CMSC connections paid off, as we were able to take others whose trips were already filled.

Monday morning revealed overnight snow in the mountains. We headed for Aspen Highlands and found the groomed runs were perfect with a fresh coat of 2 inches of fluffy stuff. By 11, the sun was out and it turned into a glorious day of skiing. By 3 pm we were skied out and ready for refreshments on the patio at the Highlands Alehouse. Except for Senny Wegner who had to get just one more run in. Tuesday brought another snowy morning that continued into the afternoon. Many of us went to Snowmass to ski the powder all day. It was just a tad on the heavy side, so a good workout was had by all.

Wednesday was a midweek break day for many. Again, we went to Highlands and Snowmass to ski more fresh snow. While we played, Deb Bramschreiber was busy preparing for our poolside après-ski party. After determining that the deck gas grills were not working, she got The Gant maintenance staff on it and they were ready to go by the afternoon. So at 5:30 we all gathered for grilled pork tenderloin finger sandwiches, sausage, cheese, and of, course wine.

Thursday brought another powder day. We headed for Snowmass again, and up to the Elk Camp area. This time the powder was of the light and dry kind. So it was easy to look like a hero plowing through it. We met up with Enid Cleaves and Gladys Hansen, who flew out the night before. We worked our way over to Upper Alpine Springs for a black run in the chopped up powder. Then it was up to the Big Burn, for a run down Sheer Bliss. The fluffier snow made skiing a lot easier than 2 days earlier when it was Sheer Work. Finally a run down the Big Burn to finish off a perfect day on the slopes.

Friday was our last day to ski. We did Snowmass again. This was finally one of those Spring blue bird days that Colorado is famous for. After a week of powder, it was OK to find a little slush at the bottom of the hill in the afternoon. Gathered around the fire pits at Venga-Venga at the end of the day, we toasted on our good fortune to be here, and the Spruce boughs Tom Sitter stuck in his helmet to prove he'd been "tree skiing".

That night we had our farewell dinner back at Ryno's. After the obligatory departure details, it was time for the Lunar Award nominations. Tim Parker left his backpack on the Alpine Springs Lift and did not notice it until a half hour later. Dick Wortiska skied down to reclaim it from the lifties. But the winner with a double nomination was Niels Jensen. When Laurie Lindberg went to use the facilities at a mountain restaurant, she heard a familiar cough coming from the stall next to her. She looked down on the floor and noticed the ski boots were also familiar and pointing the wrong way. "Niels, is that you?" Sure enough!

The trip home was uneventful until the Lamers Bus picked us up at Chicago. The Badgers were scheduled to play Kentucky in the Final Four, and we could not find an FM station with the game (no AM antenna in the bus). We had friends texting us game updates until we got to Fond du Lac where we got the second half on FM. Oh well, the Badgers lost shortly after we dropped off at The Bar. Thanks especially to Deb B for all her work organizing our farewell dinner, as well as shopping, preparing and cooking our poolside party. And also to Ryno's and The Gant for their wonderful facilities, Aspen for the mountains, and last of all, Mother Nature for the great snow.

The National Bike Challenge is a nationwide event uniting thousands of current bicyclists — and encouraging countless new riders. It is a free and easy way to challenge yourself, your colleagues and your community to ride more while competing on a local, state and national level. We aim to unite 50,000 riders to pedal 30 million miles from May 1, 2014 until September 30, 2014. The challenge is free to all.



We are forming another cycling team to participate in the National Bike Challenge this summer. The name of the team is “NEW Skiers”. Membership is intended for those of us that participate in Gelandesprung Ski or Sly Fox Ski and Snowboard Clubs. Family and supporters would be welcome as well.

Our team last year logged more than 11,000 miles and 13,000 points. Gladys Hansen (Sly Fox) finished in first place from our clubs last summer with nearly 4,000 points by consistently riding her bike to work and back, about four miles per trip. Just as last year, 20 points are awarded each day that you ride 1 mile or more. You also receive 1 point per mile ridden (i.e. 5 mile ride gets 25 points). There is a prize program that you can read about along with lots of other information on the <https://nationalbikechallenge.org/> web page. But I ride for fun and enjoy the camaraderie of the challenge.


